Douglas County Drug Court-Participant Handbook

Welcome

Welcome to the Douglas County Drug Court. Drug Court was created as an alternative to incarceration for defendants who have been charged with a felony and have a substance use disorder. This program will hold you accountable in efforts to lead a clean and sober life. This handbook will outline the program and provide you overall information about the Douglas County Drug Court. You are expected to follow all the guidelines outlined and instructions given in Drug Court by the Judge and by treatment providers. In order to address your personal needs, the treatment team will develop an individual treatment plan.

The Drug Court Team

The Drug Court Judge will make all decisions regarding your participation in Drug Court with input from the Drug Court Team. Prior to your appearances in Court, the Drug Court Team will review your progress to assist you in continuing to advance in the program and recovery. Progress Reports

Prior to every Drug Court hearing, the Drug Court team reviews progress reports prepared by the supervising Adult Services Officer and Treatment Provider(s). In the reports, the Team is provided your drug and alcohol test results; information regarding your participation in treatment, your attendance at probation appointments; your employment status, and any additional information requested. The Judge will use this information to discuss with you your progress in Drug Court. Rewards and Sanctions may be given based upon progress in Drug Court.

Drug Court Hearings

While in Drug Court, you are required to attend court on a regular basis as directed by the team. The frequency of your court appearances will be based upon your current Phase of Drug Court. If you fail to appear in court, a warrant may be issued for your arrest and you will be held in custody until you can be seen by the Judge. If you are unsure of a court date or time, you should contact your Adult Services Officer.

Confidentiality

Federal and State law requires your privacy be protected. Douglas County Drug Court has strict policies and procedures to guard your privacy. You will sign a Consent for Disclosure of Confidential Substance Use Information. The disclosure is for the sole purpose of your participation in Drug Court.

Phases of Drug Court

Drug Court is approximately 14 months, divided into four (4) phases. Each phase must be successfully completed prior to transitioning to the next phase. Participants can earn early advancements in the last two phases of program (Phase III & Phase IV). Earned Participation Credit (EPC) allows one in compliance to advance 30 days earlier in these phases. All phases must be successfully completed prior to your graduation.

DRUG COURT RULES

As a participant in Drug Court you are required to abide by the rules outlined in the participant contract, including but not limited to:

1. Tell the truth;
2. Not use, possess, distribute, or sell any drugs or alcohol;
3. Not associate with any person selling, manufacturing, possessing, or using controlled substances;
4. Report to your Adult Services Officer as directed and follow all lawful directives given;
5. Attend and participate in all ordered treatment sessions;
6. Be on time for Court, all treatment sessions, and any other required meetings or appointments;
7. Dress appropriately for Court and treatment sessions;
8. Not make threats towards other participants or staff, or behave in a violent manner;
9. Not associate with a known felon with the exception of attending Drug Court or treatment programs;
10. Not bring any drugs, alcohol or weapons to treatment sessions or into Court;
11. Remain in the courtroom for the duration of the Drug Court Docket.
12. Complete high school diploma or GED (if you do not have one);
13. Obtain and maintain employment providing verification to Adult Services Officer;
14. Notify Law Enforcement you come into contact with that you are a Drug Court participant;
15. Notify your Adult Services Officer of any Law Enforcement contact;
16. Not possess, own, or use a firearm and/or ammunition;
17. No sexual contact, dating, or intimate relationship with any current Drug Court participant, or other member of your treatment program;
18. Not move, change residence, or living environment without the prior approval of the Drug Court Team.

REWARDS AND SANCTIONS

Douglas County Drug Court uses rewards and sanctions to reinforce compliance with program requirements.

The Court will place your name into a monthly drawing for every week you are sanction free. A name will be drawn at random each month, the winner of the drawing receives a basket full of prizes.

You will be given a punch card you can use to earn punches and turn in for prizes. Punches will be given for a variety of prosocial, treatment, supervision and recovery-based positive actions.

Examples of **Rewards** given may include:

- In Court praise
- Reduction in Court appearances
- Community Service Work in lieu of court costs/fines
- Gift cards and Phase up Rewards
- Letter of recognition
- Earned Participant Credits in Phase III & IV
- Restoration of lost privileges
- Reduction in curfew (if one was imposed)
- Selection of prize(s) from the "goody bag"

When the Judge determines that you have violated or not complied with Drug Court rules, the Judge may impose a sanction. The Team will make a recommendation whether to sanction and what sanction to impose. The Drug Court Judge will make the final decision.

Examples of **Sanctions** given may include:

- Admonishment from the Drug Court Team
- Writing assignment
- Letter of apology
- Community Service Work
- "Day In Court"
- Curfew and Travel restrictions
- Increased Court appearances
- Demotion of Phase or extension of current Phase
- Electronic Monitoring
- Increase in drug and/or alcohol testing (You may also be required to pay a % of the cost of the testing equipment.)
- Jail Sanction

BEHAVIORS THAT MAY RESULT IN SANCTIONS AND/OR TERMINATION

Examples of Behaviors That May Result in Sanctioning and/or Termination Include:

- Being Dishonest with Drug Court Team;
- Having a Positive drug or alcohol test; failing to show for a drug or alcohol test; producing a diluted or adulterated sample;
- Being late or failing to attend treatment; probation appointments; or Court;
- Failing to report contact with law enforcement;
- Failing to disclose to law enforcement your involvement in drug court;
- Being arrested and/or convicted of a new offense;
- Leaving Douglas County or the State without prior authorization, or moving outside Douglas County;
- Violating Curfew-(if one was imposed);
- Possessing alcohol, drugs or drug paraphernalia;
- Willfully not complying with a Court order or Team recommendations.

DRUG AND/OR ALCOHOL TEST PROCEDURE

The Drug Court requires random drug and alcohol testing in addition to testing as requested by the Drug Court Team or treatment provider(s). You will be assigned a pin code and enrolled in the random pin code calling system. You are expected to call as directed and outlined in the Drug Testing Pin Code Agreement. All drug screens will be observed to ensure compliance and proper chain of evidence is followed. Your sobriety is important to your success in Drug Court. Your drug and/or alcohol usage while in Drug Court is taken seriously. If a positive drug or alcohol test is submitted, you may receive an immediate sanction. Examples for sanctions imposed can be found by viewing the Violations and Sanctions Continuum.

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)

During your involvement in the Drug Court, you may request or be considered for medication assisted treatment. Approved medications may be prescribed to reduce your cravings and urges to use alcohol and/or opiates. This will be considered especially for those clients who have a history of relapse, or report cravings as an issue in staying sober. If you begin receiving MAT, you are expected to remain active in Drug Court and follow treatment guidelines and protocols. You must meet with a nurse and/or doctor on a monthly basis to discuss prescribed medication and report any concerns or complications immediately. If you are currently receiving MAT services, you must authorize communication between the Drug Court Team and all medical professionals involved in your MAT treatment.

Graduation

Eligibility for Graduation is based upon successful completion of the Treatment Program and satisfaction of all court requirements. Graduation from Drug Court is recognized as an important event. Your loved ones will be invited to join you at a Special Ceremony. The Drug Court Team will congratulate you for all the hard work you put into achieving a Life Changing Gift- Recovery! You will withdraw your guilty plea, and the State will file a Motion to Dismiss your case. If you were admitted into Drug Court as a Felony probation revocation case the probation subversion is terminated.

Post-Graduation Follow Up

To help the Douglas County Drug Court provide the best possible treatment options for future participants, we ask graduates to participate in post-graduation follow ups. These are conducted in a manner to provide the least inconvenience to the graduate. Follow up studies and requests may include: background checks to check continuing drug-free status, letters, phone calls, questionnaires, possible speaking engagement opportunities, and alumni group opportunities.

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
