



AVOID EVICTION NOW

The CDC's nationwide eviction moratorium extended to June 30, 2021. The Kansas state-wide ban on eviction ends May 28, 2021. There are national protections against eviction for non-payment of rent beyond the Kansas date.

If you receive a **notice to vacate** or a letter of **eviction** from your landlord:

- You must attend the hearing for your eviction case to prevent an eviction. If you do not attend the hearing, the default decision will be to approve your eviction order. If you are not sure of the date of your hearing, you can check the [Douglas County eviction docket](#). If you have received a threat of eviction or have been issued a notice to vacate, you likely have a scheduled hearing.
- You are not required to vacate a property until a decision has been reached by a judge in a formal eviction court setting. If no hearing has occurred, you are not legally required to vacate your residence.
- To prepare for your hearing, you must provide evidence of your efforts to receive rental assistance. You can apply for rental assistance through the [Kansas Emergency Rent Assistance](#) (KERA) program. Douglas County residents are also eligible for rent assistance through the [Housing Stabilization Collaborative](#) (HSC) program.
